#### **Program Narrative**

The Marion Police Department and Marion County Sheriff's Office are jointly requesting funds allocated to Marion County under the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program for FY 2019 Local Solicitation.

The Marion Police Department is requesting funds for the purchase of 11 sets of ballistic plates for the 11 members of the Special Response Team (SRT). SRT was established to provide specialized support in handling critical field operations where intense negotiations and/or tactical deployment methods beyond the capacity of field officers appears to be necessary. SRT is specifically trained and equipped to work as a coordinated team to resolve critical incidents that are may exceed the capabilities of first responders or investigative units. This includes, but is not limited to, hostage taking, barricaded suspects, snipers, terrorist acts and other high-risk incidents. As a matter of department policy, such a unit may also be used to serve high-risk warrants, both search and arrest, where public and officer safety issues warrant the use of such a unit.

Due to the specialized and high-risk nature of their operations, this additional protective gear is needed. The ballistic plates will help provide another layer of protection. The purchases will be made through Storm Dog Tactical no later than the end of the first quarter in 2020. Once received, the ballistic plates will be placed into service immediately for the SRT.

The Marion County Sheriff's Office will purchase tactical battery packs, 15' and 25' cartridges for their TASER devices from Axon Enterprise, Inc. The purchases will be made no later than the end of the first quarter in 2020.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signifies that the City of Marion and the Marion County Sheriff's Office have reached an agreement on the Justice Assistance Grant funds for FY2019 that have been appropriated for Marion County, Ohio. For Marion County, Ohio, a total of \$10,995 has been allocated.

Both parties have agreed to a split of the grant funding, with the City of Marion receiving \$7,028.00 and the Marion County Sheriff's Office receiving \$3967.00.

Both parties have agreed that the City of Marion will apply for and administer the grant.

Both partied agree that the Marion City Auditor will establish a distinct line item account specifically for these funds and these funds will not be co-mingled with any other funds.

Both parties agree that the City of Marion will advance the funds into this account and that all reimbursements from the Justice Assistance Grant program will be used to repay the General Fund of the City of Marion.

Both parties agree that the Marion County Sheriff's Office / Marion County Commissioners will reimburse the City of Marion General Fund any over-expenditure of the \$3967.00 (MCSO portion of the grant) from the established line item account. The City of Marion will be responsible for any over-expenditure of the \$7,028.00 (City of Marion portion of grant).
