Volunteer of the Month

MEET ANGELA THOMAS

Can you hear me now?

Quite a few members of the Marion Senior Center can answer yes to that question now, thanks to the volunteer efforts of Angela Thomas.

Angela has been overseeing free hearing screenings at the center for a little over five years now. The screenings are available once a month on the second Tuesday of each month. "We have a lot of people after they having the screening done, who say, 'why didn't I do this sooner?" Angela explained.

Angela has been in the medical field since she was 18. When she was at a crossroads in her career, she was considering real estate when she happened across an advertisement for medical sales that seemed a perfect fit. "I went on the interview and they hired me at the interview," she said. And she's been working for Beltone ever since, becoming a stated licensed hearing care practitioner five years ago.

Angela enjoys her work especially when clients find out that they can afford a hearing aid. "There's something for everyone," she explained, adding that untreated hearing loss can cause more problems than just missed conversations. "They've linked untreated hearing loss now to dementia, depression and Alzheimer's."

What she finds truly rewarding after testing someone's hearing and fitting them with a hearing aid is how, after they begin wearing it, they begin hearing better and better. "Hearing is like anything, if you don't use it for a long time you lose more and more of the ability to hear," she said. "And more and more insurances are covering the cost of hearing aids."

The hearing screenings at the center are completely free, as are any screenings held in her office—if someone is unable to make the screening day at the center. The screening itself is simple and pain free.



"First we check for wax and then we do a pure tone testing and speech testing," she said. The pure tone testing finds the lowest level at which a person can hear and helps determine if they have mild, moderate or severe hearing loss. The testing also tells her whether or not the hearing loss is medically related or if it can be alleviated with a hearing aid. "If there's a medical reason for the hearing loss, we refer them to a doctor," she explained.

In addition to the hearing screenings, Angela, via Beltone, volunteers at the center in other ways. Most recently she helped with the Thanksgiving luncheon and Beltone will be sponsoring the center's Christmas dinner.

Angela enjoys helping out at the center and seeing familiar faces each time. "A lot of patients come here," she said. "I think one of the best things I hear about here at the center are the trips. The staff is also supportive and accommodating. They have a genuine interest in the people who come here."

Angela, who will be 41 in December, is originally from Upper Sandusky and lived there until two years ago when she moved to Marion.

Angela and her husband have five children at home, ranging in age from 17 to four. "Sometimes I come to work to relax," she joked.

When she's not working or helping out at the senior center, Angela enjoys family time at home or outside with the children. She is also an avid deer hunter.
