Senior Citizens Day Celebration!




You're an Inspiration!

Volunteer of the Month

MEET RAY HUGHES



Our volunteer of the month, Ray Hughes, a resident of Uncapher Ave in Marion, is certainly an interesting and remarkable individual. He has survived multiple injuries and health problems that would stop a lesser person but he soldiers on even becoming an active volunteer at the Center as he oversees the Monday pinochle games (setting the tables and handling the money). He also assists at the pool tables and makes the most of his approximately 15 year membership in the Senior Center.

Ray was born on August 24, 1940 at Radnor, Ohio. His large family included five sisters and two brothers. While he was still a baby his family moved and Ray attended elementary school at Pleasant eventually moving on to high school at Harding. He married Mary on November 7, 1958 and they will soon celebrate their 60th anniversary. Ray and Mary had four children and currently have 27 great grandchildren and counting. Among their three daughters is a set of twins, Debbie and Diane. It is often said that twins run in families and Ray would concur in that he himself has a twin brother, Roy Hughes.

Ray is an avid motorcyclist. Accompanied by Mary he has driven his motorcycle in 27 states -all the way to California. On a par with Ray's love of motorcycles is his love of golf. He plays on local courses such as Green Acres and Windy Acres. He proudly states that he has made seven aces (holes-in-one).

Ray was employed in the steel industry. He retired approximately 20 years ago after a 32



year career at Armco Steel (NKA Nucor) as a department supervisor. As a reliable key employee the company even sent him to Sweden in 1990 to inspect Swedish steel operations.

The most impactful moment of Ray's career at Armco occurred in 1995 when a 900 pound roll of steel fell on his left foot and fractured several vertebrae. Fortunately, first responders were able to save him, but the accident required two rods to be inserted in his back to support his vertebrae allowing them to heal. Fortunately, his foot although mangled was saved. Up until the time of this accident Ray's department had a perfect safety record. The devastation of this injury continues even today. The two rods are still in his back and his left foot requires a prosthetic shoe.

Complicating Ray's precarious physical condition was a minor stroke that he suffered requiring a pacemaker implant about 3 1/2 years ago.

It is inspiring to talk to Ray and see a man who has endured difficulties in life and overcome them all the while maintaining his faith in a better hereafter. His attendance at the Foursquare Church in Marion helps him maintain his positive attitude.
