







SOUTH SEFFNER HOMICIDE

On January 18, 2021 around 10:41 p.m., officers from the Marion Police Department responded to the 120 block of South Seffner Avenue for a reported shooting call. Upon their arrival, they found 43-year-old Ricco D. McGhee who had been shot and seriously injured. McGhee was transported to Marion General Hospital where he died from his injury.

The Marion Police Department, with the assistance of the Marion County Sheriff's Office and the Marion County Prosecutor's Office, worked the homicide and developed 17-year-old Ziair Green as the suspect. A warrant issued for him for aggravated murder and he turned himself in on January 21, 2021.

"We thank all of the citizens who have come forward with information on this case and we encourage anyone with additional information to call the Marion Police Department. The City of Marion has zero tolerance for gun violence and the continued cooperation of the public will help us ensure that those responsible for these kinds of serious crimes are held accountable" said Marion Police Chief Jay McDonald. "I encourage Mr. Green to turn himself in and do the right thing" said McDonald.





January 25, 2021 - The alternative jail on Rose Avenue advised that Tyler Millisor jump out a window on Saturday night and then returned. He was arrested for Escape and taken to Multi County Jail. (2021-00327)



2ND/3RD SHIFT POSITIVES

January 1, 2021 - Officers responded to a reckless driver report on Lee St. Upon investigation, they recovered a stolen truck from Wyandot County. Rusty Jordan was charged with several crimes. (2021-00012)

January 9, 2021 - Second shift officers responded to a stabbing call on Uhler Ave. where two people stabbed by David Tobin. David was arrested with out incident. (2021-00124)

January 10, 2021 - The Mansfield Police Wives of Ohio dropped off several goodie bags for officers.

January 11, 2021 - Officer Galyk responded to Van Buren Ave. on a welfare check. He conducted a thorough investigation which lead to the arrest of James Farley for domestic violence and the arrest of his mother Collese Cornwell for Obstructing Official Business. The victim was removed from dangerous situation and is currently receiving assistance from Turning Point. (2021- 00157)

January 12, 2012 - Officers responded to a shots fired call at 235 Pearl St. Officers recovered several spent shell casings in the roadway. The residence was struck several times and nobody was injured. Patrol units were assisted by the Detective Bureau. (2021 - 00175)

January 18, 2021 - Officers responded to 126 Seffner St. on a shots fired call. Upon arrival, they located Rico McGee who had been shot. He was transported to Marion General where he was pronounced deceased. Officers did an excellent job securing the crime scene and locating evidence. Patrol units were assisted by MARMET, the Detective Bureau and MCFD. A suspect was developed and 17-year-old was later arrested for Murder. (2021-00255)

January 21, 2021 - Officer May & Lt. Elliott responded to a rollover crash at N. Main St & Fairgrounds St. Upon arrival, witnesses pointed out the at-fault driver who was attempting to flee the scene. The driver was caught at the Stay Inn motel where he was identified as Eddie Bruce. The driver of the other vehicle was pronounced deceased at the scene. Units were assisted by OSHP and MCFD. Officers Cochell and Kelly along with Lt. Musser assisted OSHP on the crash scene. (2021-00290)

January 24, 2021 - Officers responded to 208 Lincoln Ave. on a shots fired call. Officers were unable to get anyone to answer the door. Officers interviewed witnesses who confirmed the person who fired the gun was inside the house. It was also learned that there was possibly a injured person in the residence. A perimeter was established and units attempted to make contact over the PA. No one would answer the door. SRT was activated and eventually forced entry and arrested numerous people. Patrol officers were assisted by the Detective Bureau, MCFD and MCSO. (2021 - 00326)

January 27, 2021 - Officers responded to 410 Glad St. for a shots fired call. The investigation revealed that James Wilson had an altercation with some young men in the park behind his residence. He then fired a couple of rounds from a handgun into the ground in an attempt to scare the young men. Wilson was charged with Pointing and Discharging. The entire shift responded to the call and Officer Rector is primary. (2021-00357)

January 28, 2021 - Officer Kelly conducted a traffic stop for running a red light. Lt. Elliott and K9 Six responded and did a vehicle search. K9 Six alerted and a search was conducted. Marijuana and a handgun were located in the vehicle. The suspect, Alexandrea Moran, admitted the handgun was hers. Moran has previous weapons convictions. She was charged with Weapons Under Disability, CCW. Improper Handling. (2021-00375)




DETECTIVE BUREAU REPORT

The Grand Jury met four times this month.


Felony Cases Submitted by Year

January's schedule was quite busy. At the start of the month I officially began my full duties as the Juvenile Liaison officer and JV MPACT Coordinator.


- January 10th —I was introduced to the JDAI group to go over the part I will be playing with Juvenile Court.

Two siblings/brothers in ED class got into an argument which escalated to a fight. The instructor in the class was knocked over while trying to keep the two apart. The instructor wanted nothing done, she even made the request that both subjects be returned to class. School admin advised no L.E. assistance was needed. Discipline was handled by the school.

I have been providing extra patrol to the area of George Washington Elementary before school and after school due to complaints about traffic-related issues from neighbors in the area. No violations have been observed so far.

No criminal charges were filed during the month. I assisted the Grant-Withrow staff with one incident where a student was in possession of drug paraphernalia. I took control of the items and documented the incident with a report. 2021-00385. The school is handling the discipline and I'm working with the staff to make sure these types of things don't keep happening in the future.


K9 Six had 3 deployments.







SPECIAL RESPONSE TEAM REPORT

Monthly training for January was held on January 27th. The SRT Team met at the police department and performed the yearly inventory audit of equipment. The team then went to the Waldo Sportsman's Club and performed firearms drills.

The Marion SRT had one activation for the month of January. On January 24, 2021 Marion Police Department patrol units responded to 208 Lincoln Avenue for the report of a shooting. It was determined a shooting had taken place involving this location. Due to the severity of the incident and patrol not being able to make contact with anyone inside of 208 Lincoln Avenue the Marion SRT Team responded to the location.

During the course of the activation less lethal chemical munitions were deployed into the home. The Marion County Counter Assault Team also assisted at the scene with the deployment of a robot and a pole camera into the residence to search for suspects. Once entry was made multiple individuals were located inside the residence.

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT REPORT

This month we began researching possible funds available to conduct two scrap tire drop off days for city residents. I was able to contact Ohio EPA and they advised they're possible grant monies that would cover the disposal/recycling of the scrap tires collected in our city. Sindy Thrapp will be following up on that and we hope to have the first drop off in the spring.

This month I was able to collect 375 scrap tires in the city right of ways. Most of the tires were collected in the area of Waterloo St to Oliver Ave and W Center St to Latourette Park. Several were also collected from the 600-1000 block of N State St in rear alley way. I will be targeting an area weekly to get all scrap tires removed from city right of way.

I had been getting several complaints about suspicious activity in a city alley that runs along the west end of Fairview apartments. This alley is not supposed to be used, but several subjects are parking there and using the

alley. I met with the Fire Inspector and we came up with a plan to block the alley off. The city garage was in fact able to block the alley off. The apartment complex manager was very excited about this, along with neighbors in the area.

Several of the meetings planned have been cancelled until next month.

I also began targeting areas with several traffic complaints. I worked the areas of Fairwood Ave and George Washington Elementary School.

This month I had 92 calls for service and removed 54 vehicles or got them back into compliance.

I encourage everyone to contact me with any questions, concerns or complaints.



Total Traffic Stops




Citations vs. Warnings









Top 10 Arrests/Summons by Charge












Arrest/Summons by Day








Gallons of Gas Used
