Volunteer of the Month

MEET JUDY KUCHAR

Judy Kuchar came a long way to find a home cooking in the Marion Senior Center's kitchen.

Born in Dayton, Judy was raised in Columbus, but moved to Illinois four months before she graduated from high school, and 28 years ago the 75-year-old (on February 20) moved to Arkansas before finding her way to Marion.

"We moved back to be with family," Judy said. "We found a house in Caledonia and there are 8 of us living there, more on the weekends. We can have 10 to 12 for lunch then."

Judy heard about the kitchen opening back in July when she and her husband, Jack, first moved to Marion. "Someone at church said the center was looking for someone," she said, adding with a smile. "That was in July, but I didn't get a chance to check on it right away because we were busy with moving and settling in."

But then in November, she stopped into the center and talked about the opening and started working in December. She cooks a meal at the Center on Mondays. Her cooking experience started years ago during a stint as a cook in her local school district. "That and fixing Sunday dinner every week," she laughed.

During her time in Arkansas, her church also had a soup kitchen where she lent a hand and a fish fry that served over 6,000. "I didn't do the cooking there, the men did the frying for that," she said.

Judy joined the center when she came in to see about the cooking position, and while she is impressed with the center and the variety of activities offered, she hasn't had a chance to participate. "I've just been too busy," she laughed. "But I think there are a lot of activities."

Before retiring at age 70, Judy had a career in banking, most recently serving as a banking loan assistant for 9 ½ years. Overall, however, she was in the banking field for 40 years. Judy said she would still be working if she could find a job.

Judy retired five years ago, when she got sick. She had cancer and the chemotherapy treatments took a toll on her immune system.

In her spare time, Judy enjoys singing and sewing. "I used to have a van that said, 'Judy Ann's Best of Gospel

Music,' and I used to go to nursing homes and sing gospel music.

"I love to sew too, make quilts and sew for my grandkids, do mending," she added. "They'll come in and say, 'Grandma, can you fix this?' and I'll say, just throw it on the pile."

Judy and Jack have two daughters, five grandchildren (one is deceased) and five great-grandchildren. The couple is raising one of their great-granddaughter's, Brittany, who will be 10 in August. "We have guardianship," she explained. "We were afraid we might not get guardianship because of our age, but we did."

In addition to cooking at the center and caring for her family. Judy is working on another dream—getting her high school diploma. Judy left high school four months before she graduated to marry Jack. "I wasn't pregnant," she smiled. "That was just what you did back then." And she's been dreaming about remedying that situation.

"I'm working on that," she said. "They told me I can't graduate from the high school I attended, that I will graduate from River Valley."

Judy's lack of a diploma never hindered her work career, however. "The applications never asked if I graduated, just how many years of schooling," she said. "I even have one year of college."

Judy and Jack will celebrate 57 years of marriage on February 28. "Jack's birthday is February 3, mine's the 20th and our anniversary is the 28th, so we get it all done in one month," she explained.

She and Jack are members of Marion First Church of the Nazarene.
